ORDINANCE NO. C-11-21

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 28 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE. FLORIDA. ENTITLED WATER. WASTEWATER TO PROVIDE FOR CURRENT STORMWATER. FUTURE INCREASES TO WASTEWATER USER RATES. TAPPING CHARGES, WATER RATES, SPRINKLING METER CHARGES. PRIVATE FIRE SERVICE **PROTECTION** CHARGES. STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM RATES. SERVICE AVAILABILITY CHARGES. AVAILABILITY RECONNECTION CHARGES: PROVIDING FOR REVISIONS TO INTEREST PAID ON UTILITY DEPOSITS: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY: PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale supplies water and sewer services on a regional basis to approximately 250,000 residents of central Broward County; and

WHEREAS, areas provided potable water service and wastewater service by the City include Fort Lauderdale, Port Everglades, Lauderdale-by-the-Sea, Oakland Park, Sea Ranch Lakes, Wilton Manors, portions of unincorporated Broward County, Davie and Tamarac; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive water and sewer rate study was conducted by Burton & Associates, Inc. for the City which established a plan of rate adjustments and rate structure modifications, which plan was accepted and implemented by the City; and

WHEREAS, said rate study was recently updated and it has been suggested that a rate indexing structure utilizing the U.S. Consumer Price Index Water and Sewerage Maintenance Index and a percentage formula be employed in the calculation of rates, fees and charges; and

WHEREAS, the necessity for water main replacement and sewer rehabilitation throughout the City, increased costs associated with security at City utilities, and other ongoing capital needs require an increased level of fund transfers into the capital program; and

WHEREAS, to generate necessary funds for present and future needs, administration, operation and long-range projects under the Water and Sewer Master Plan, it is necessary to increase wastewater user rates, tapping charges, water rates, sprinkling meter charges, private fire service protection charges, service availability charges and service availability reconnection charges; and

WHEREAS, to generate necessary funds for present and future needs, administration, operation and long-range projects in connection with the Stormwater Management Program, it is necessary to increase stormwater management program rates; and

WHEREAS, interest on utility deposits currently paid at the rate of four percent (4%) should be revised to protect the fiscal integrity of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale has notified all customers of this Ordinance through the regular utility billing process, pursuant to Section 180.136, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems the proposed amendments to the Code of Ordinances to be in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That Section 28-76 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 28-76. Wastewater user rates.

- * Note 1: By April 30th of each year, the City Manager shall determine if as of September 30th of the year prior whether projected revenues based on adjusted rates exceed the following five criteria: 1) annual revenues exceed annual expenses, 2) net revenue is at or above 2.0 times annual debt service expenses, 3) there is an operating reserve at least equal to 120 days of operating costs, 4) there is an unrestricted capital reserve of at least \$10 million, and 5) there is replacement and repair funding of at least \$10 million. If there is projected revenue that exceeds these five criteria, the current customers shall receive a proportionate rebate of the excess funds on their water/wastewater bill in the same fiscal year. For purposes of this Note, revenue, expenses, and net revenue are as defined in City Commission Resolution No. 03-29.

For sizes greater than an eight-inch tap and service, such charges shall be estimated and billed upon a basis of actual cost, including materials, labor, equipment and a percentage allowance for administrative and overhead costs. All tapping and service charges shall be paid in full before the fire service is installed.

<u>SECTION 6</u>. That Section 28-189 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 28-189. Interest on deposits.

Not less than once per year, interest shall be credited to the customers account at the rate of four (4) percent simple interest. Said interest shall be computed and credited to the customer's account based upon the balance of the deposit on hand for that account. At the convenience of the city, interest may be credited to the account more frequently, however the amount paid shall not exceed four (4) percent simple interest computed upon the available deposit on the account. No person, business or other entity shall be entitled to interest payments on any deposit made under this division or pursuant to Sec. 24-51 of this Code.
