Broward County Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Budget

The Broward County Commission is currently in the middle of our annual budget discussions for FY 2022. The pandemic has had a profound impact on Broward County's economy and people as well as our Broward County Budget. Fortunately, the federal government has aided counties and cities to assist us in continuing all our services as well as provide further assistance for members of our community. This year, my goal is to not raise your millage rate and continue to serve our residents with this year's tax roll as well as the federal aid.

I have consistently advocated for the funding needs for affordable housing, homelessness, traffic improvements and most recently increased funding for our Animal Care Center. At our June 17th Budget Workshop, I was pleased that our County Administrator recommended to increase the funding for Affordable housing this year.

During the summer, the County Administrator will provide her final recommendation for the FY2022 budget. Stay tuned for more information. In August, the Board will meet again to discuss several outstanding issues. Our Budget Public Hearings are scheduled for September 9th at 5:01pm and September 21st at 5:01pm. 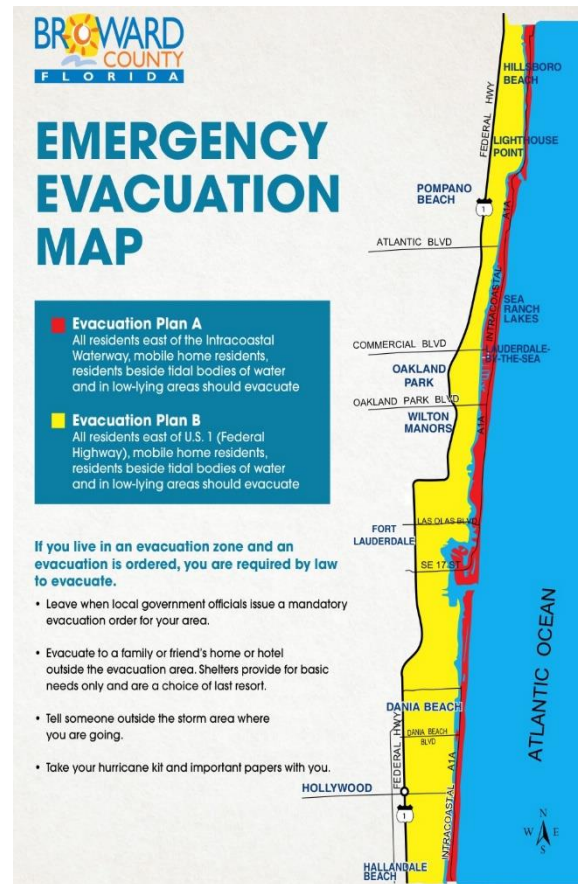
Hurricane Preparedness

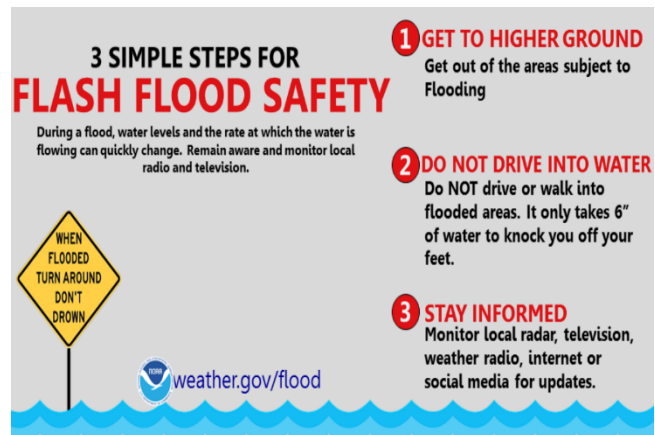

Mosquito Season



COVID-19 EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS
A rental household meeting the following:

- At least one individual in the household qualifies for unemployment or has reduced income, significant costs or financial hardship due to COVID-19.
- Risk of homelessness or housing instability.
- Household income at or below 80% of area median income (AMI). Visit this page [for an income breakdown](#).
- Must be a renter/landlord in Broward County.

AVAILABLE ASSISTANCE
Eligible households may receive up to 12 months of rental and utility or energy costs arrears (in addition to or separate from rental assistance), plus an additional three months if needed to ensure housing stability and if program funds are available.

APPLICATION PROCESS
Applications may be submitted by either an eligible tenant or by a landlord on behalf of an eligible tenant.

PAYMENT
Rental assistance funds will be paid directly to the landlord/property management company or utility company on the tenant's behalf.
