
Dear Community Members,

Segment II Beach Renourishment Project

Turtle season will come to an end October 31st, which means the Segment II Beach Renourishment project will shortly begin. At the end of April, right before turtle season began, the beach was renourished from approximately NE 8th Place, 3,500 feet north of the Fisher Family Pier, down to about SE 6th Street, 3,000 feet south of the pier. Starting in November, sand will begin to be placed from around SE 6th Street in Pompano Beach south to the Pompano Beach/Lauderdale by the Sea line. Additionally, work is also expected to begin 300 feet south of the Hillsboro Inlet south to NE 7th Place in Pompano Beach. Subsequently, Fort Lauderdale is expected to begin to see sand replenishment in December through April 2022. For regular updates and/or specific information, visit

Update on Coastal Commuter Link

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has set a combination of an inperson/virtual public workshop focused the proposed commuter rail for November 18, 2021, at 6PM at Broward County's Government Center East. The in-person workshop will be conducted in Commission Chambers (115 S. Andrews Avenue Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301). As I've previously reported, the FDOT and Broward County are performing the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for the Broward Commuter Rail along the Florida East Coast Railway from Aventura in Miami-Dade County to Deerfield Beach in Broward County. I'm most excited about the three stations recommendations in District 4 in the cities of Oakland Park, Pompano Beach, and Deerfield Beach. The biggest hurdle in this process is the New River Crossing. Four potential alternatives have been identified, a 25-foot low-level bascule bridge, 56-foot mid-level bascule bridge, 80-foot high-level fixed bridge, and a tunnel underneath the New River. ePermits OneStop


Broward County's Consumer Protection Division recently received a Government Project Award for the County's ePermits OneStop from The Center for Digital Government. It is exciting to see my initiative, which began with the City of Pompano Beach, grow exponentially over the past couple years. ePermits OneStop is a portal that allows customers to upload documents, submit permit applications and pay fees all in one place, from the convenience of most city hall.

Broward County Transit Goes Green

Broward County Transit (BCT) has recently placed two new electric buses on the road, carrying passengers, on Route 22 on Broward Blvd. from Sawgrass Mills Mall in Sunrise to Broward Central Terminal in Fort Lauderdale, BCT purchased 12 battery-operated electric buses and expects to put them in service by late fall as it transitions to an allelectric fleet. I'm glad that our transit system is moving forward with placing these excellent buses on the roads as they will help to reduce carbon emissions, improve air quality, and provide passengers with a quieter and smoother ride. 
