Manatee Season



Manatee season started November 15 and runs through March 31. During this time, the County's Natural Resources Division implements the County's Manatee Conservation Program and cautions boaters to be on the lookout for greater numbers of manatees throughout the County's waterways. We encourage boaters and visitors to help keep these gentle giants safe

U.S. Flag Disposal Program

Broward County participates in the national campaign to support flag etiquette with the U.S. flag disposal program. The County's flag disposal program provides designated boxes at several locations for residents to drop off American flags so that they are properly disposed of. When a flag is worn, tattered, ripped, or soiled beyond repair, it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country and should be retired.
