The recent closure of the park has been a major concern for many of you that utilize the space for health and wellbeing. I understand the particular importance of the park to the Imperial Point community. My direction to the City Manager's office has been to continue negotiations with Broward Health in order to maintain the park space. I appreciate all of the community's input and public participation in this matter. You have spoken up and have been heard.

Bridge Vs. Tunnel

As the debate for a bridge or a tunnel continues, my stance remains that a light rail crossing is necessary for the City's growth in the next hundred years. Current trends include population growth, increased rent and home values, traffic increases, and a national push towards less vehicle emissions. The best way to prepare for the impacts to the City from these forces is to start with light rail and continue building the community with transit oriented design.

While we continue to review the costs and feasibility of each option, we must also understand that our partnership with Broward County is vital for rail completion. I will continue to listen to the desire of residents, while also working with Broward County to bring rail across the New River.
