Convention Center Update

Broward County is excited about the progress the Convention Center Expansion and Headquarter Hotel. We are nearing completion and I'm extremely enthusiastic for the grand opening of this magnificent project that will boost our local economy. The ongoing construction phase of the project is progressing and scheduled for completion in Fall 2025. The project site currently has a steady stream of



activity, employing over 300 people on the field on any given day. As is typical with large scale projects like this one, the Convention Center expansion project faced some challenges which include fluctuating market conditions, supply chain restraints and more. I commend the County's team for diligently working with the developers to mitigate any delays. The developers agreed to contractual final completion dates as follows: Convention center (East Expansion) – August 2025, Convention and Visitors Bureau Building, Plaza and Hotel – November 2025. Port Everglades Cruise Update

The Board of County Commissioners recently approved the extension of the user agreement between Port Everglades and Royal Caribbean Group through September 30, 2030. Port Everglades and Royal Caribbean Group are also exploring facility upgrades for Cruise Terminal 29 to accommodate newer ships across the company's fleet. According to an analysis by national maritime economic consultancy Martin Associates, this agreement will boost the local economy to the tune of \$581.9 million in business revenue annually through increased cruise activity from 2027 to 2030. The port will welcome at least 1.3 million guests annually, and 355 vessel calls each year. It would support 4,095 jobs in the region annually, including 1,829 direct local jobs, 1,221 indirect jobs and 1,046 induced jobs. I want to personally thank the Port Everglades team for their tremendous work to continue this partnership, which continues to bring visitors to our area and boost our local economy. Fort Lauderdale International Airport Update

The Broward County Aviation Department recently announced that they have received a \$16 million grant from the Federal Aviation Administration as part of funding investments in U.S. airport facilities. This funding will go towards the replacement of approximately 14 passenger boarding bridges and associated ground power and pre-conditioned air units at the airport. In all,

FLL is replacing 39 passenger boarding bridges across three terminals to improve the travel experience and operational efficiency. This boarding bridge replacement project is targeted for completion in late 2026 at an estimated cost of \$46 million. This was a highly competitive federal funding process, and I commend the Aviation team on their great efforts!

2024 Presidential Election



This year, I've been fortunate enough to serve on the Canvassing Board with Supervisor of Elections, Joe Scott. The Canvassing Board has several responsibilities. These include certifying logic and accuracy testing on voting equipment, reviewing and accepting signatures on Vote-by-Mail ballot envelopes, reviewing damaged and poorly marked ballots, reviewing provisional ballots, certifying results of the election, conducting a post-election audit and conducting recounts. It is vital that voters clearly mark their intended choices.

With Election Day only a couple days away, voters are encouraged to make an election plan and get out to vote. Thankfully, there are several ways to make your voice heard this election season. (1) If you've already ordered your vote-by-mail ballot you can return it by mail, or by dropping it off at any early voting location. (2) Early voting locations are now open from 7am to 7pm through Sunday, November 3. Visit BrowardVotes.gov to find the location nearest you. (3) The last day to cast your vote is Tuesday, November 5. On Election Day you must go to your assigned precinct.

Additionally, I was happy to sponsor an agenda item to waive bus and paratransit fares on the last two days of early voting, Saturday, November 2 and Sunday, November 3, as well as on election day Tuesday November 5.
